With the Inquiry focus this term on "The Arts," it puts the spotlight on what is referred to as "The Hidden Curriculum." The Hidden Curriculum refers to the unwritten, unofficial and often by – product lessons, values and perspectives that students derive from their daily interactions with teachers. The academic, social, moral and behavioural expectations established by schools, that communicate messages to students.

A teachers regard for respecting and sometimes challenging authority is exposed, as is regard for diverse societal conventions. For respecting the personality, ideals and opinions of Tamariki. For engendering a positive attitude and empathy towards others, aspiring to achieve and having a work ethic. For engendering a love of literature, music, art and dance. These are examples of how relationships through The Hidden Curriculum or just casual day to day interaction can have a huge impact on Tamariki.


I also respectfully ask that the park designated for wheelchair parking be reserved for purpose it was designed.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – MAY UPDATE

Kia ora koutou Houghton Valley School whānau

It's hard to believe we are halfway through Term 2!

The Board has two important welcomes to make.

Firstly, we would like to say a warm welcome to the HVS Acting Principal, John Wootton, who is doing an excellent job steering the HVS waka in Luana's absence. Ukelele lessons for the tamariki are an unexpected bonus!

We are also delighted to announce that Jesse Pirini has agreed to join the Board of Trustees as a co-opted member. Jesse has a background in Māori development and innovation. With the Board wanting to strengthen our focus on Te Ao Māori and Te Tiriti, we are very fortunate to have Jesse join us. Thanks for coming on board the Board Jesse!

Our May Board hui was held earlier this week, and we were lucky to have Stephanie Bosch, the Inquiry Learning Leader, deliver a presentation about the Inquiry approach to learning undertaken at HVS, and what HVS kaiako are doing to develop their practice. You might be aware that this term the Inquiry topic is "What does it mean to be an artist?"

As part of the presentation Steph emphasised the importance of tamariki having the opportunity to talk about their learning with whānau. Each class is working on displaying the students' learning journey on the wall - we encourage you to come into your child's classroom before or after school to have a look at their work and talk to them about their learning.

As mentioned in our March update, one of the key areas of focus for the Board this year is ensuring we are meeting our obligations under Te Tiriti of Waitangi at a governance level. Several members of the Board recently attended a workshop run by the New Zealand Schools Board of Trustees Association (NZSTA) - Giving Effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi; it was a very productive workshop and members of the Board will be attending the second part of the workshop in August to for further training.


